Title: WIDENING THE CIRCLE OF FAITH, JOHN 1:29-42 (Chatham, NJ; 01/19/14, AM) [Pc - Topical]

Theme: The church grows most effectively when we model Andrew's recruitment of Peter and Philip's recruitment of Bartholomew: one on one, person to person.

Purpose: To remind us how the faith spreads, and to encourage us to pray for friends, neighbors, and opportunities to share the Gospel that we haven't even had yet.

## Introduction:

- 1. Sociologist Rodney Stark suggests that "social movements grow much faster when they grow through existing social networks," and conversion to a new religious group occurs when "people have or develop stronger attachments to members of the group than they have to nonmembers." (Stark, Rise).
- 2. In evangelistic terms, conversion happens one-on-one and person to person.
- 3. How else could the early church have grown without the use of mass media?
- 4. Efforts to spread the Gospel any other way can result in greater awareness of the message, but those things do not produce conversions.
- 5. Implication: every Christian must seek to fulfill his role as a "Light of the world."
- 6. Isaiah 49:6 attached that role to the nation of Israel, and Paul uses the same passage to justify evangelizing the Gentiles, Acts 13:47.
- I. The Action Sequence of Witnessing, Psalm 40 demonstrates what helps drive evangelizing
  - A. An honest, humble heart, 8 & 17
    - 1. Allusion to Christ, Heb. 10:5-7
    - 2. Representative of what we should be receptive, obedient
    - 3. Humble commitment to God's ways
  - B. Psalmist feels the weight of sin, 12
    - 1. A burden upon his heart
    - 2. Recognize the truth that "all have sinned"
  - C. Leads to a song of deliverance, 9-10
    - 1. The psalmist does not withhold his exuberance and witness
    - 2. Though he still needs God's help (13), he is confident (17)
- II. Andrew Widens the Circle of Faith, John 1:29-42
  - A. God has prepared Andrew as a member of the nation of Israel
    - 1. He was looking for the Messiah
    - 2. He displays an searching heart
    - 3. He believed the prophecies and he believed John
    - 4. He follows Jesus because of John's witness
  - B. One day convinced him
    - 1. He spent the rest of the day talking with Jesus, 39
    - 2. After his own conversion, he goes and tells someone else, his brother
    - 3. Isn't this the exuberance of witness and faith?
  - C. Andrew thus widens the circle of faith
    - 1. His witness to Peter models the conversational nature of evangelism
    - 2. People talk about their beliefs to those close to them
    - 3. Jesus engages in conversation with Nicodemus and the woman at the well
    - 4. Such dialogues bring about faith
    - 5. Philip (John 1:43-51) does the same for Bartholomew

- 6. We think he is the other half of the two who spent the day with Jesus
- 7. Both Philip and Andrew are paired again in John 12:20-26 where they seek to introduce some Greeks to Jesus (already the person to person approach is bearing fruit among the Gentiles)
- 8. Look through Acts and consider that although Paul did his original preaching in the synagogues, during the week others often spread the word and brought more people to hear

## III. The Message Is Christ: "We have found the Messiah"

- We have demonstrated in the last week just how important this is
- We used to be able to assume people understood this, now I don't think we can
- His nature and his atoning work are foreign to people but still needed for the Gospel
- Discussions of such things are surely evangelistic

## Conclusions:

- 1. Develop a love and thanksgiving for your salvation; this led to the Psalmist's exuberance.
- 2. Remember the role of the Holy Spirit, and pray.
- 3. Pray for your friends and neighbors.
- 4. Pray for opportunities and open doors for discussion.
- 5. Pray for society.
- 6. Witness even in the face of opposition: never surrender (1 Peter 3:15).
- 7. You are the light of the world; let it shine.
