Title: A SERVANT'S ROLE, 1 CORINTHIANS 3:1-9 (Chatham, NJ; 02/16/14, AM) [D – Exegesis]

Theme: A servant rises above petty jealousies because he humbles himself and allows God to do the work that only God can do.

Purpose: To clarify what is true spirituality and to remind us that God is the important factor in church growth.

Introduction:

- 1. Do we sometimes forget just how unimportant we are?
- 2. Luke 17:10 "We are unworthy servants."
- 3. Inflating our sense of importance stems from a misunderstanding of spirituality.
- 4. Spirituality is defined in terms of our relationship to others as well as our relationship to God.
- I. True Spirituality, 1-3
  - A. Off the rails
    - 1. Corinthians pursuit of spirituality has jumped off track
    - 2. Arrogant behavior among them, 4:6-7, 19; 5:2
    - 3. Boasting, 1:29-30; 3:18, 21; 4:7
    - 4. Puffed up with knowledge, 8:1
    - 5. Divisions groups divided against one another, 1:11-13
    - 6. Jealousy and strife, 3:3-4
    - 7. Beware the illusion of the false spirituality that fails to account for our relationships with one another
    - 8. What did this look like?
  - B. A mark of spiritual immaturity
    - 1. Quarreling, 1:10-11
    - 2. James 3:4-5, jealousy and selfish ambition is demonic wisdom
    - 3. Gal. 5:19 seven of these apply to Corinth
- II. True Status of Christian Leadership
  - A. Instruments in God's Hand
    - 1. Individuals do not define the Christian life and doctrine
    - 2. Paul and Apollos in Corinth, Acts 18:4, 11; 24-28
    - 3. Paul made disciples (though he personally baptized few of them)
    - 4. Apollos taught, encouraged, and strengthened them
    - 5. As a tandem team, they planted and watered
  - B. Servants Only
    - 1. Mark 10:45 Jesus came to serve
    - 2. John 13 he washes the feet of the disciples
    - 3. Phil. 2:1-11, he served to the point of giving his life
    - 4. Paul maintains this humble perspective
    - 5. Conclusion: none of us is truly indispensable
    - 6. All of us must see ourselves as servants
    - 7. No one greater than the others, Rom. 12:3-4
- III. God's Primacy in the Work of Salvation
  - A. God gives the growth
    - 1. What sounds perfectly logical and reasonable can easily be forgotten

- 2. We think the more we push, cajole, and persuade the more conversion will occur
- 3. Paul says "we persuade men" (2 Cor. 10:3-5)
- 4. At the same time, only those drawn by God, can come to him (John 6:44)
- 5. God works in the human heart when we can see or do nothing to assist the change
- 6. We must be patient like a farmer waiting for seeds to grow
- 7. We can plant and water but nothing else
- 8. A seed will grow on its own if the soil is right
- B. We Must Be United in Purpose
  - 1. To be his servants who plant and water
  - 2. To be his witnesses to the ends of the earth

  - To Glorify God
    We are his field and building
  - 5. And we are his fellow workers

## Conclusions:

- 1. True spirituality takes the role of a servant.
- 2. It is not jealous, and it does not cause strife or quarrels.
- 3. Plant and water and let God do His work inside the human heart.
- 4. The seed is the word of God, the Gospel: hear it, believe it, confess it, and obey it in baptism.
