Title: PREPARED FOR THE JOURNEY, PHILIPPIANS 3:17 – 4:1 (Chatham, NJ; 02/24/13, AM) [Pc – Exegesis]

Theme: The Apostle Paul reveals three things that we must do in order to continue our journey to our one and only home, heaven.

Purpose: To exhort the congregation to remain steadfast and continue their journey faithfully by imitating the right examples, rejecting an earthly lifestyle, and remembering that our citizenship is in heaven.

Introduction:

- 1. Abraham set out on a journey to a land promised to him.
- 2. Israel journeyed to the Land of Canaan.
- 3. Jesus set out on a journey that climaxed in Jerusalem, Luke 9:51.
- 4. Early Christians were said to follow "The Way."
- 5. Paul, in Philippians 3:17-4:1 provides guidance for the journey.
- I. Imitation, 3:17
 - A. Israel
 - 1. Be holy because God is holy
 - 2. They were to imitate the God they worshipped
 - 3. Joshua's leadership provided the image of faithfulness, Josh. 24:15
 - B. Keep your eyes on Jesus, Heb. 12:2-4
 - 1. The one who perfected our faith
 - 2. The one who endured hostility
 - 3. The one who shed his blood for us
 - 4. Sometimes we endure persecution, 1 Peter 2:20-21
 - 5. Yet we keep our eyes on him
 - C. Imitate Paul and other good examples
 - 1. Imitate my example, Paul says
 - 2. Look for others who have also set a good example
 - 3. Note the importance of modeling Christianity for others
 - 4. It is an enduring witness to the Gospel
- II. Reject the earthly lifestyle, 3:18-19
 - A. Beware of the nations
 - 1. Israel told not to imitate the ways of the nations
 - 2. God was driving them out because of their evil ways
 - 3. Jesus resisted the temptations of the world, Luke 4
 - 4. He was tempted in every way, yet without sin, Heb. 4:15
 - 5. Jesus also resisted Herod's threats, Luke 13:31-33
 - 6. Notice that Jesus is determined to finish his journey to the Holy City
 - B. Paul describes the adversaries
 - 1. Their end is destruction
 - 2. Their god is the belly: no restraint or moderation
 - 3. Glory in their shame: proud of their self-indulgence
 - 4. They have an earthly mindset
 - 5. Paul advises the Colossians in 3:2 to set their minds above on spiritual things

III. Heavenly Citizenship, 3:20

- A. The journey mindset: this is not your real home

 - We live as pilgrims
 We live in a foreign country
 - 3. We long for our true home, Heb. 11:13-16 (read)
- B. We look for our savior to come for us, 3:20-21
 - 1. He will come from the heavenly dwelling
 - 2. He will transform our body
 - 3. He has the power to do that and to subject all things to himself
 - 4. He has authority over the universe, its elements, and all mankind

Conclusion:

- 1. Keep the hope of your eternal destination ever before you.
- 2. Look for good examples to follow.
- 3. Though no one is perfect, look for the good each one has and imitate that.
- 4. Remember the power of Christ: he conquered death.
- 5. Don't grow weary on your journey.
- 6. Stand firm, 4:1
