Title: WHY JESUS? WHY NOW? MATTHEW 17:1-9 (Chatham, NJ; 03/06/11, AM) [E – Topical]

Theme: In the Transfiguration we have answers to the questions, "Why Jesus? Why now?"

Purpose: To show that the Transfiguration provided Peter and the church with a dramatic demonstration of why we believe in Jesus.

## Introduction:

- 1. In an age of so many religious voices and choices, today we will answer the question that may be on the minds of many, "Why Jesus?"
- 2. In an age also sees itself as modern, technologically advanced, and scientific, we will answer the question, "Why Now?"
- 3. Why Jesus in this day and age, at this time in history?
- 4. The experience of the Apostle Peter provides the answers we seek.
- I. What Peter Saw: the Transfiguration, Mt. 17:1-9.
  - A. A brief description.
    - 1. Peter, James, and John accompanied Jesus up a mountain.
    - 2. Both his face and his clothes took on a bright appearance: the sun, light, 2.
    - 3. Moses and Elijah appear and speak with Jesus, 3.
    - 4. Peter offers to build a memorial, 4.
    - 5. A bright cloud and a voice: "This is my Son...Listen to him," 5-6.
    - 6. Fear overcomes them, 6.
    - 7. But when they get up, they see only Jesus, 7-8.
  - B. What he thought about the event later, 2 Peter 1:16-21.
    - 1. This wasn't something made up (16, 20-21).
    - 2. We witnessed his majesty and heard the voice of God, 17-18.
    - 3. These were not ordinary experiences. (I am unaware of other religious leaders who have been so transformed.)
    - 4. Because of this, you do well to pay attention, 19.
    - 5. This was almost as pivotal a moment as seeing Jesus after the Resurrection.
    - 6. Only now he could talk about it (Mt. 17:9).
    - 7. This is one of the reasons that brought Peter to believe and to live his life proclaiming that all people should believe in Jesus.
- II. Why Jesus? (The Transfiguration is one of many reasons.)
  - A. Because of what he said.
    - 1. John 7:46 the officers' answer
    - 2. These men were taken back by his teachings.
    - 3. His claims were and are controversial, John 8:58.
    - 4. A deluded soul, a liar on par with Satan himself, or one who is truly Lord says these things.
    - 5. The Apostles and the church choose Lord.
  - B. Because of what he did.
    - 1. Can anyone do more. John 7:31?
    - 2. His miracles pointed to something powerful in him.
    - 3. John 14:10-11, believe on account of what you have witnessed; this is what he says to his disciples.
  - C. Because of the resurrection.
    - 1. Initial shock turned to joy, Luke 24:36-43.

- 2. They turned the world upside down with their teaching.
- 3. The Gospel of Christ is the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ.

## III. Why Now?

- A. Our scientific age needs something more.
  - 1. We live in an age of scientific materialism, a school of thought that believes the material world is all there is and everything can be explained by physical things.
  - 2. Deep inside we chafe at this; intuitively we know there is something more.
  - 3. That something more is the transcendent God revealed by Jesus, Jn. 1:18, and the transcendent world he spoke of, Jn. 14:2, "I go to prepare a place for you."
- B. Other religious choices are weak and fraudulent.
  - 1. John 14:4, "No one comes to the Father except through me."
  - 2. Whereas other religions (through wisdom or by looking within) may claim enlightenment and knowledge of spiritual things. Jesus he is the way to them.
  - 3. What Jesus said, what he did, and his Resurrection make him relevant to any and all ages.
  - 4. No other faith can legitimately offer you eternal life because no other faith has a risen savior.

## Conclusions:

- 1. The world needs reconciliation because it is in the grip of sin and under condemnation.
- 2. It needs salvation because without it judgment looms.
- 3. Sin has condemned us; the only escape is repentance and belief in the Gospel.4. Christ offers this salvation through his death, burial, and resurrection.
- 5. Won't you accept our offer to see what this story of Jesus is all about?
