Title: THE PRACTICE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS, 1 JOHN 3:1-7 (Chatham, NJ: 04/19/15, AM) [E – Topical]

Theme: God's plan for the Gospel from prophecy to preaching has always been to establish the practice of righteousness.

Purpose: To enable a change in our hearts by hearing the proclamation of the Gospel.

Introduction:

- 1. God's plan is like an unfolding telescope: demonstrate with telescope.
- 2. God provides enough information for one generation to see a little farther than the previous generation.
- 3. Sometimes we like to speak of standing on the shoulders of giants.
- 4. Think about how far your children or grandchildren could see sitting on your shoulders.
- 5. We build our lives with confidence on what God has done so that what comes next can be better for those who follow.

I. Prophecy and Prediction

A. Predictions of a Messianic Future

- 1. Jesus established his work on prophecy, Luke 18:31.
- 2. After the resurrection he returns to prophecy to enlighten the disciples, Luke 24:25-27 44
- 3. Peter's eyewitness is further sustained by the prophets, 2 Peter 1:19-21.
- 4. He utilizes this in his preaching, Acts 2:17-21, 25-28; 3:18, 22-24
- 5. The prophets, however, weren't privy to the full revelation, Luke 10:24 (point to the first part of the telescope)
- 6. God demanded faith even if they couldn't see far into the future.

B. Prophecy, furthermore, also called people to righteousness and obedience

- 1. Isaiah 1:4 laments the sinful condition of Israel
- 2. He appeals to them in 1:18-20
- 3. When Micah's audiences criticized him, he challenged them, Micah 2:6-7
- 4. He declared to Israel her transgressions, 3:8
- Jeremiah and Ezekiel warned Israel that their captivity was the result of a long and persistent state of disobedience.

II. Proclamation

A. The disciples role

- 1. Repentance and forgiveness should be proclaimed, Luke 24:47
- 2. The disciples were witnesses not only to Jesus' deeds but to the prophetic fulfillments
- 3. This was the next section of the telescope of God's message (point to second section of telescope)
- 4. Tonight's segment of A. D. will portray this.
- 5. Their work brought them on a collision course with the reigning world powers, both religious and secular.
- 6. Proclamation of the Gospel was/is subversive of the world order

B. Continuing the legacy of the Apostles

- 1. Pass on to faithful men, 2 Timothy 2:2
- 2. Can we accept the challenge of being a giant upon whom others can see farther?
- 3. Has God placed us in the time of preaching "out of season" (2 Tim. 4:2)?
- 4. The light of this message becomes more visible during times of darkness: 3:1ff. speak of times of difficulty

We must sustain the proclamation not only for ourselves but for those who will come after us

III. Practice of Righteousness, 1 John 3:1-7

A. An Old/New Message

- 1. Righteousness is as old as the prophets
- 2. God has always demanded that people return to his laws
- 3. Truth, God's nature, and the created order have not changed
- 4. Note recent discussion on the radio centered on one person's parents, married for 38 years, and on pre-nuptial agreements: "an earlier age stayed together in marriage, but this is 2015." (by implication things have changed and we can't go back to an earlier age)
- 5. This is surrender to the spirit of the age
- 6. But marriage is still a permanent covenant between a man and a woman
- 7. And God still demands obedience
- 8. This can sound new to a generation who has never heard these things
- 9. They benefit from standing on our shoulders
- B. John's proclamation pierces the darkness, 1 John 3:1-7
 - 1. Sin is lawlessness, and we are called to be pure as God is pure, 3-4
 - 2. To "abide" in God means that we must cease from sinning, 6
 - 3. Children of God or children of the devil (7-10): which will it be for you?
 - 4. This is what the past points to: the last part of the telescope

Conclusion:

- 1. The biggest reason people resist seeing this is that it demands a change in their lives.
- 2. We are those who proclaim this in word and deed.
- 3. Can you see how this affects you?
- 4. Can you see how this might affect the next generation?
- 5. Remember the prophets; hear the proclamation; practice righteousness.
- 6. The church is the bearer of this message, and we proclaim to you the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ.
- 7. God waits for your response.
