Title: LOOKING FOR THINGS THAT LAST, 1 PETER 1:17 – 25 (Chatham, NJ; 05/08/11, AM) [Pc – Expository]

Theme: After experiencing the Resurrection Peter and the other disciples decided that they had experienced something that would last into eternity.

Purpose: To illustrate how Peter understood the Resurrection affected his flock long after he had experienced it and long after many others had come to faith.

Introduction:

- 1. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus experienced an "aha" moment when they realized Christ had appeared to them, Luke 24:31.
- 2. His words had boiled up in them when he spoke to them, verse 32.
- 3. They said to themselves, "We have to go back," 33. They returned to the others.
- 4. New information and a new experience changed them.
- 5. At a later time Peter explains to the early church how it affected them, 1:17-25.
- I. God Has Acted and Implemented His Plan of Salvation.
 - A. He planned this from the beginning.
 - 1. Chosen before the foundation of the world, 20.
 - 2. This is a peek into the mystery of the nature of God: he knew the future and planned for it.
 - 3. Christ has been revealed in these last times (epoch).
 - B. He redeemed (ransomed) us, 18.
 - 1. In Mark 10:45 Jesus reveals his role: a ransom fee.
 - 2. He came to serve in this capacity.
 - 3. He purchased us out of the slavery of sin.
 - C. He purified us, 22.
 - 1. Peter emphasizes our role by noting that our obedience to the truth purified us.
 - 2. However, the whole tenor of this discussion reveals that God was the true agent of purification; we responded to Him.
 - D. We've been born again, 23.
 - 1. When Jesus explains this, he reveals that the Holy Spirit is the agent.
 - 2. God has come into our world.
 - 3. Not only did Christ come in human form, but he has left us with redemption and with purification that can be experienced.
- II. How We Are Drawn Into the Plan
 - A. Call on God as our Father, 17.
 - 1. The premise of his remarks reflects a relationship.
 - 2. God is our Father.
 - 3. Our hope and faith are in him, 21.
 - B. Conduct yourselves with fear.
 - 1. The right kind of fear heightens the senses and prepares us for danger.
 - 2. Later in 5:8 Peter reminds us that our adversary in on the prowl.
 - 3. "In exile" conjures up the image of Israel in foreign lands.
 - 4. In a place that does not belong to us, we are at least not comfortable.
 - 5. Perhaps getting comfortable is something that creates problems.
 - 6. There are dangers on this journey.

- C. Love one another, 22.
 - 1. From a "pure" heart, not a tainted one
 - 2. Connected with "sincere brotherly love"
 - 3. Love earnestly.
 - 4. Purity, sincerity, and earnestness: without guile.
 - 5. Quotes about love:
 - a. To be loved, be lovable.
 - b. Most of us want very much to be loved. Perhaps we are not concerned enough about loving.
 - c. Love looks through a telescope; envy, through a microscope.
 - d. We find rest in those we love, and we provide a resting place in ourselves for those who love us.

III. Perishable versus Imperishable: What Things Will Last?

- A. The blood of Christ, 18.
 - 1. Is blood really imperishable?
 - 2. Hidden behind the physical death of Christ was an eternal plan.
 - 3. The physical blood changed our spiritual condition.
 - 4. Mysteriously it still affects us by cleansing all who come to Christ.
- B. Word of God, 23.
 - 1. This makes more sense to us.
 - 2. Words have the power to influence, change, and motivate.
 - 3. Peter quotes Isaiah 40:6, 8.
 - 4. God's word has an eternal nature.

Conclusion:

- 1. Peter refers, of course, to the good news of the Gospel of Christ, 25.
- 2. Reaching back to the plan from the foundation of the world and reaching forward into the future, Peter exhorts us to remember that which endures: the blood of Christ and the Word of God.
- 3. In John 6:27-29 Jesus exhorts the crowd to spend their time pursuing that which is
- 4. From Resurrection Sunday to the present the experience of the disciples has been to pursue that very thing.
- 5. What else can provide you with things that don't perish, fade, or wear out?
- 6. Choose the Gospel! You won't be sorry when eternity comes.
