Title: COME BECAUSE I AM COMING, REVELATION 22:17 (Chatham, NJ; 05/12/13, AM) [E – Topical]

Theme: Even if we are unsure about a literal 1,000 year reign of Christ, we can be sure that Satan has been defeated, that Christ is making all things new, and that He is coming soon.

Purpose: To remind us to have faith in these essential truths.

Introduction:

- 1. I take a traditional approach to the millennium known as amillennial, which means I believe that chapter 20 is a metaphor and not to be taken literally.
- 2. It is the approach adopted by Augustine, one that has stood the test of time and tradition.
- 3. I won't say that all the details of Revelation fit with this snugly, but considering all the false predictions given by those who believe in a literal 1,000 years, this position seems a little more sensible.
- 4. When prognosticators keep being wrong, the predictions can be adjusted only so many times.
- 5. Into this mix there are some things that all Christians believe.
- I. Satan has been defeated, and death will also be destroyed
 - A. Satan's binding (20:2)
 - 1. Victory belongs to Christ
 - 2. Destroyed the works of the devil, 1 John 3:8
 - 3. Freed us from the fear of sin and death, Heb. 4:14-15
 - 4. This may not be the reference in Rev. 20 because Satan is still actively deceiving people (3)
 - 5. At the same time, we are confident that he has lost the ultimate battle
 - 6. Honestly I don't know about his release and capture a second time, 7
 - B. Death will ultimately be destroyed, 20:14
 - 1. 20:11-15 paints a picture of final judgment
 - 2. Death and Hades thrown into the lake of fire
 - 3. Those whose names are found in the book of life will enter eternal life
 - 4. Evil people will suffer the second death (condemnation)
 - 5. Jesus told us this in very literal terms, John 5:28-29
 - 6. Paul affirms the death of death, 1 Cor. 15:54
- II. All things new, 21:5
 - A. New heaven and earth, 21:1
 - 1. Peter also said this, 2 Peter 3:13
 - 2. Creation awaits the transformation, Romans 8:22-23
 - 3. No tears, no death, no mourning, no crying, 21:4
 - 4. These have no place in the new order of things: verse 8
 - B. New Jerusalem and River of Life
 - 1. The holy city is a bride whose radiance is like jewels, 11
 - 2. She is walled off and adorned with jewels, 19

- 3. No temple since the Lord is present throughout, 22
- 4. No night there, nothing unclean, no temptations, 27
- 5. The river of life flows from the throne of God, 22:1-2
- 6. It waters the Tree of Life, the same tree Adam and Eve were separated from when caste out of the garden
- 7. The inhabitants will reign forever and ever, 22:5

III. He is coming soon, 22:7

- Do not seal up this book, 10, for the time is near
- He is coming in judgment, 12
- This is both fearful and to be anticipated
- Fearful for those who do evil, anticipated for those who follow the Lamb
- Wash your robes, 14
- Be diligent to be found doing good, 2 Peter 3:14
- Come (3xs), 17
- Take from the water of life (now?), 17

Conclusion:

- 1. "I am coming soon," 20.
- 2. Long for his coming: "Amen, come Lord Jesus!"
- 3. Do not fret over evil men, Ps. 37:1-2
- 4. Do not fret over those whose predictions have failed to materialize.
- 5. We are assured that Satan has lost, that all things will be made new, and that he is coming soon.
- 6. Always keep before you the promise of His coming.
