Title: IF YOU LOVE ME, JOHN 14:15 – 24 (Chatham, NJ; 05/25/14, AM) [D – Exegesis]

Theme: Jesus explains the resulting behaviors that come from the claim that we love him.

Purpose: To explain his statements and to demonstrate that God lives with those who obey.

Introduction:

- 1. "If you love me" is a suppositional statement that should be followed by "then," a condition of the first statement.
- 2. The second statement is necessary to satisfy the first. If this, then that.
- 3. Without the second requirement, the condition is not met.
- 4. In this statement the idea that we love God is dependent on whether we obey him.
- 5. Jesus applies this logic in several ways.

I. If . . . You Will Keep My Commandments (15 & 21)

A. Love obeys

- 1. Loving God is not the first step; it sets up a condition that can only be satisfied by keeping the commandments.
- 2. We demonstrate our love for God by obedience.
- 3. John affirms as much in 1 John 2:4-6.
- 4. First, we cannot claim to know God if we don't obey.
- 5. Second, keeping God's word perfects love.

B. Love and obedience: equated, or at least inseparable

- 1. The obedient person is the one who loves Jesus, verse 21
- 2. Romans 13:8-10, love fulfills the law because love obeys it
- 3. Obedience demonstrates love for God
- 4. This kind of love transcends mere emotional attachment: we don't fall in love with God, we demonstrate love for God

II. If . . . You'll Be Loved by God, and Jesus Will Manifest Himself, 21

A. Loved by my Father: God reciprocates

- 1. The one who loves Christ (by his obedience) will be loved by the Father
- 2. Not necessarily a condition of God's love, see 1 John 4:10-12; God loved us first by sending his Son
- 3. We can still affirm that God loves all mankind, even those who hate him, Jn. 3:16
- 4. More of an affirmation that God provides special care for those that love Him

B. Jesus will manifest himself to that person

- 1. "Manifest" is used in Exodus 33:13, 18 when Moses asked God to reveal Himself
- 2. It is also used of Christ post-resurrection "appearances"
- 3. Christ is revealed and experienced at a new level to those who obey
- 4. Obedience breeds an awareness of Christ: we come to know Him because we share in his way of life and inmost thoughts. John 15:15
- 5. As 1 John 2:4-6 affirmed, we cannot claim intimacy with God if we disobey
- 6. Knowing God transcends any miraculous event, vision, or alleged spiritual experience: we know God when we obey him

III. If . . . We Will Make Our Home with Him, 23

A. The one who keeps my word

- 1. If he keeps my word, my Father will love him
- 2. This repeats what Jesus has already affirmed, 17

- B. God will make his home with us
 - 1. He dwells with you, 17
 - 2. He abides with us, 1 John 4:12
 - 3. Home is a place of refuge; God is the refuge of the righteous, Ps. 18:1-2
 - 4. Home is also a place of familiarity, comfort, and love

Conclusion:

- 1. We are aware of God's presence, not by the miraculous and the supernatural, but by our obedience to his Word.
- 2. It doesn't demand some special spiritual endowment to experience "God with us."
- 3. In all of this, he sends The Helper, 16.
- 4. He does not abandon us as orphans, 18.
- 5. Obedience leads to an awareness of familial bonds, 20.
- 6. The most important result is that we will live, 19.
- 7. Do you love God? Obey him.
- 8. Do you want God to be present in your life? Obey him.
- 9. Do you want to live? Keep his word.
- 10. Obedience is the most authenticating activity to experience the presence of God.
- 11. It is open to all; won't you be open to it today? Christ is revealed and experienced at a new level to those who obey
