Title: THERE FROM THE BEGINNING, MARK 4:35 – 41 (Chatham, NJ; 06/24/12, AM) [D, E – Topical, Inductive]

Theme: The incident on the Sea of Galilee when Jesus calmed the wind and waves demonstrated to the disciples that Jesus was no ordinary human.

Purpose: To bring us to the conclusion that Jesus was higher than any other man, and to persuade us to preach that message to others.

Introduction:

- 1. Religious literacy, knowledge of the teachings of Christianity, has suffered at the hands of experience in religion and moral living.
- 2. Though these are important for the Christian, knowledge of who Christ is won't allow us to separate doctrine from morality.
- 3. Christian doctrine is more than a water boy for morality.
- 4. The morality taught by Jesus comes directly from the nature of God.
- 5. His moral teachings are reality, laws woven into the fabric of the universe.
- 6. We need to know the truth about who Jesus is to fully grasp his morals.
- 7. We also need to know it in order to set him apart from other religious founders.
- 8. The disciples' experience on the Sea of Galilee is definitive.

I. What the Disciples Knew

- A. About God
 - 1. Deuteronomy 6:4 He is one and the only one
 - 2. Psalm 95:3-5, God created and owns all things; the Psalmist calls the assembly to worship and to heed his voice.
 - 3. Exodus 20:2 he is the foundation for all their laws
 - 4. God presence is everywhere: Jeremiah 23:24 fills heaven and earth; 1 Kings 8:27 heaven and earth cannot contain him.
- B. The Book of Jonah (he could not escape God)
 - 1. The story, more than anything else, hinges on 4:2, the nature of God's love
 - 2. Just as important is 1:9; when Jonah reveals that his God created everything, we have it affirmed that the God of Israel created all things
 - 3. 1:15-16, the sea grew calm (eerily foreshadowing of the See of Galilee?); they "feared the Lord exceedingly."

II. What They Saw on the Sea of Galilee, Mark 4:35 – 41 ("Who then is this," they ask, "that even the wind and sea obey him?")

- A. Questions about Jesus swirled around him throughout his ministry
 - 1. The man born blind put the logic of his miraculous cure together.
 - 2. "If this man were not from God, he could do nothing." (9:33)
 - 3. Later when people disputed about him some asked this question, "Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?" (10:21)
- B. Who can control the wind and the waves?
 - 1. They had already seen him turn water to wine, John 2
 - 2. At another time he walked on the water
 - 3. Now he calms a storm
 - 4. In the boat they ask the right question though they are puzzled
- III. What they concluded
 - A. John's Gospel

- 1. The prologue, 1:1-4, tells us what John concluded
- 2. Jesus claims to be divine, "I am" statement in 8:58
- 3. The signs which he performed demonstrate it
- 4. Thomas testifies to it, 20:28
- B. Essential to our faith
 - 1. Christianity is different because Christ is different
 - 2. He is the logos, the word, that upholds the universe
 - 3. Through him all things were created, Col. 1:16
 - 4. "Exact imprint" of his nature, Heb. 1:3

Conclusion:

- 1. The disciples, who believed and knew the true God, concluded that Jesus was God in human form.
- 2. He was present at creation "In the beginning."
- 3. He knows the moral laws that govern us because he made them.
- 4. All the things he did and said lead to that conclusion.
- 5. The Resurrection opened their eyes to this truth.
- 6. Thus our faith has the power to exclude all other faiths.7. This is the Jesus we that all men must believe in and obey.
- 8. Believe in and obey him today.
