Title: THE ONE THING, LUKE 10:38-42 (Chatham, NJ; 07/21/13, AM) [E – Topical]

Theme: When Jesus tells Martha that "one thing is necessary," he refers to the necessity of tending to spiritual matters and seeking after God.

Purpose: To keep our lives focused on salvation and spiritual health.

Introduction:

- 1. Remember radios where you had to turn the knob to tune?
- 2. With digital tuning a radio tunes immediately to the station without the noise and clutter associated with older tuners.
- 3. Our spiritual tuners must behave the same way; we have to focus on what is necessary and tune out what is unnecessary.
- I. The One Necessary Thing, Luke 10:38-42
 - A. A snapshot of two women
 - 1. At Mary and Martha's house Lazarus' sisters
 - 2. Martha was "distracted with much serving"
 - 3. Jesus says "You are anxious and troubled about many things"
 - 4. Mary sat and listened to Jesus
 - 5. Jesus says "she has chosen the good portion" or what is best
 - 6. Martha is not devoid of faith, John 11:22, 24, 27 (not the words of faithlessness)
 - 7. Even good people have to make daily choices as to what is most important
 - B. Choosing not to be distracted
 - Acedia laziness toward spiritual matters
 - 2. A mark of human sinfulness
 - 3. Distractions are a mark of our age today
 - 4. Even good things become evil when they distract us from spiritual things
 - 5. Tending the garden of our souls can be difficult work
 - 6. We must choose what is best at any given time
 - 7. What is the most important thing?
- II. One Person Has Preeminence, Col. 1:18
 - A. A snapshot of Christ (Col. 1:15-18)
 - 1. He is the image of God, 15 fullness of God, 19 (2:9)
 - 2. Firstborn over creation denotes preeminence, not a created being
 - 3. Created all things, 16 John 1:1-4 similarly
 - 4. Sustains all things, 17
 - 5. The head of the church, 18
 - 6. Firstborn from the dead, 18
 - 7. He is preeminent
 - B. How we make him preeminent for ourselves
 - 1. The early church confessed, "Jesus is Lord"
 - 2. Obedience demonstrates love and loyalty, John 14:15 & 21
 - 3. Keeping his word leads to fellowship with Him and the Father, Jn. 14:23
 - 4. Considering the picture in Col. 1 we have every reason to make him preeminent over our lives
- III. The One Goal
 - A. A singular focus

- 1. The salvation of our souls, 1 Peter 1:9
- 2. Peter calls it the outcome of our faith
- 3. When all things work together for our good, this is the reason
- 4. Col. 1:21-22 the whole point of the Gospel is reconciliation with God
- 5. For this purpose we believe the Gospel and for the ultimate salvation of our souls do we remain faithful to it
- 6. All other priorities pale by comparison

B. Nothing else matters

- 1. The children in Narnia are given instructions for their mission (quoted in World, 7/27/13, 71)
- 2. The signs for us are the Scriptures
- 3. The importance of knowing the signs is only as high as tending to our thoughts in relation to them

Conclusions:

- 1. Resist the impulse to ignore spiritual matters.
- 2. Resist the message that there is another Lord of heaven and earth.
- 3. Resist the temptation to put your salvation on hold as you pursue "other things."
- 4. There is nothing more important than reconciliation with God.
- 5. Paul reminds the Colossian church how it began for them, Col. 2:11-14.
- 6. He also encourages them to remain faithful, 1:23.
- 7. Don't ever lose your focus on the one thing necessary.
