Title: THE POWER OF GOD, EPHESIANS 6:10 – 12 (Chatham, NJ: 08/26/12, AM) [Pc – Topical]

Theme: Far from dieing out Christianity as a religion is flourishing because of the power and strength that come from God alone.

Purpose: To encourage us to draw on divine strength to do things we could not do alone.

Introduction:

- 1. Christianity has always been a religion driven by the power of God.
- 2. His power defeated Egypt and delivered Israel from slavery.
- 3. His power enabled David to triumph over his enemies.
- 4. His power brought Israel back to Jerusalem after they had sinned.
- 5. His power essentially saw them through any and all trials.
- 6. Most importantly, his power raised Jesus from the dead (Eph. 2:19-21).
- 7. He has empowered the church by sending the Holy Spirit.
- I. Religion Just Won't Die; Neither Will God; We live during a time when many elites want to minimize the influence of Christianity, but it won't work; it never has.
 - A. Predictions that have not and will not come true
 - 1. Mark Twain sent this in a cable back from London, "The report of my death was an exaggeration."
 - 2. ABC news tried to associate the Colorado shooter with the Tea-Party movement at first "Gee, we wish it were true."
 - 3. The same can be said for the reports about the death of religion.
 - 4. Perhaps they are more like wishes or hoped-for outcomes.
 - 5. Rodney Stark, The Triumph of Christianity, chapter 21 readings, suggests these theories are just that: hoped-for outcomes, not based in fact and reality
 - B. God is not dead either
 - 1. The 1960s heard much ado about the alleged "death of God"
 - 2. Admittedly many people left churches during that time
 - 3. But both God and religion have failed to be lost on the ash heap of modernization and scientific advancement
 - 4. Those things can never replace what God provides
 - 5. Furthermore, humans intuitively know there is something more, something that transcends the material world and holds promise for an afterlife
- II. Highways to Zion (Pilgrim ways in their hearts or set their hearts on pilgrimage), Psalm 84
 - A. Longing for God
 - 1. The psalmist longs for God, 2 (Jewish pilgrims going to Jerusalem)
 - 2. If there is such a thing as a spiritual DNA (I think there is) it is programmed to unite with its creator and all people have it
 - 3. The Bible teaches that we are made in God's image
 - 4. It is natural for the soul, even one that has sinned, to yearn for God
 - 5. Augustine said that the soul doesn't find rest until it comes to rest in God
 - 6. Like the sparrow finding a home, 3, man finds his home in God's house, 4
 - B. God empowers their hearts, 5-6
 - 1. Strength in God, 5
 - 2. Pilgrims going to Jerusalem anticipated God's presence highways to Zion in their hearts
 - 3. Their spiritual senses were heightened (I wonder if Jesus' family read this on their journeys to the feasts)

- 4. Where they passed (6) was sanctified by them
- C. The pilgrims seeking God find strength in him
 - 1. Verse 7 the first indication of God's protection is a reference to them passing by the walls of Jerusalem "from rampart to rampart" (strength to strength)
 - 2. God becomes a shield for the pilgrim heart (9, 11)
 - 3. His desire is for God's presence more than anything else, 10
 - 4. God blesses those who trust in him, 11-12
 - 5. Israel's history by now was rich with stories of God's steadfast love, but the human heart yearns for him even without knowing those stories
 - 6. Acts 17:26-27 says that God has fashioned history to promote the way of the pilgrim's journey back to Him
 - 7. If God has done this, no wonder religion hasn't died
- III. Be Strong in the Lord, Eph. 6:10-12 a need for a higher power
 - A. God's power available
 - 1. The battles of life aren't just physical, they are spiritual, mental, emotional
 - 2. Do you find strength only within our own souls?
 - 3. On certain fronts we know that we need more
 - 4. But with God we can do more, Eph. 3:20
 - 5. His power within us transcends what we can do for ourselves
 - B. Words of life, John 6
 - 1. The Spirit gives life and the flesh doesn't, 6:63
 - 2. People know how true this is, and it draws people to Jesus
 - 3. Peter refused to leave Jesus because he had the words of life, 6:68
 - 4. The issue of life weighs heavily on humanity; death is a reality that hits everyone at some point.
 - 5. As long as humanity yearns for life, Christianity will never die out

Conclusion:

- 1. Those who think that Christianity will perish do not account for the power of God; indeed they don't even believe in it.
- 2. Neither do they understand the intuitive yearning of the human heart for the one who created it; they think technology or science can provide for all of what a human being needs.
- 3. They grossly underestimate the nature of the human heart.
- 4. Religion and Christianity in particular will never die out.
- 5. We should be encouraged to know that it continues to grow rapidly around the world.
- 6. Don't listen for even a moment to those minority voices who seek to minimize its power and influence in the world.
- 7. The Gospel is a power beyond any available and we want you to believe it and accept it.
