Title: IDEALS IN ACTION. ROMANS 15:4 – 12 (Chatham, NJ; 12/08/13, AM) [Pc – Topical]

Theme: The ideals of Kingdom rule are expressed in Isaiah and Psalms; the challenge to participate is given by John; the hope offered by God is explained by Paul.

Purpose: To help the church to remember and sustain the ideal of the Kingdom and to help them keep their hope alive in what it promises.

Introduction:

- 1. The prophets cast a vision for the Kingdom of God that Paul keeps alive in Romans.
- 2. We are always in a state of preparation waiting for the King to return and take us to live with him in glory and life everlasting.
- 3. Let us continue to be encouraged by the message of the Kingdom and seek to implement it in our lives once again.

I. The Ideals Expressed and Hoped For

- A. Isaiah 11:1-10
 - 1. Branch of Jesse
 - 2. With wisdom and understanding, 2
 - 3. Judge with righteousness (4) against the wicked
 - 4. Images of peace and serenity, 5-9
- B. Psalm 72:1-7, 18-19
 - 1. The king's justice, 1-2
 - 2. Prosperity, 3
 - 3. Defending the needy and oppressed, 4
 - 4. The righteous flourish (increase?), 7
 - 5. Peace abounds, 7
 - 6. Blessed by God, 18-19
 - 7. Israel yearned for these things that are also the yearnings of all humanity

II. The Kingdom Near, Mt. 3:1-12, Images to Remember

- A. John points the way the voice in the wilderness
 - 1. Fulfillment of Isaiah and Ps. 72
 - 2. Compare 3:2 to Mark 1:15
 - 3. Repentance opens the door to entrance
 - 4. A sense of entitlement will never get one into the Kingdom: John sets the Pharisees straight on this matter, 9
- B. Camel's hair, leather belt
 - 1. Allusion to Elijah
 - 2. Austere living gets everyone's attention
- C. Bear fruit, you vipers
 - 1. Fruit is demonstrable action, 7:16-20; 12:33-37

- 2. Actions speak louder than words
- D. Axe at the root of the trees
 - 1. Brings to mind the image of a remnant: only a stump is left
 - 2. The Kingdom tears down the old structure and removes the dead wood
 - 3. Jesus will baptize with fire: judgment and purification
- E. Winnowing Fork
 - 1. Separate the wheat from the chaff
 - 2. Even though many didn't believe and may not today, it becomes more and more evident all the time just who is and who isn't a part of the Kingdom of God

III. Endurance, Encouragement, and Hope, Romans 15:4 – 12

- A. God's work on Fulfilled, Ps. 72:18-19
 - 1. He is the God of endurance and encouragement, 5
 - 2. God's truthfulness revealed in Christ, 8
 - 3. He is the God of hope, 13
 - 4. By the power of his Holy Spirit, we abound in hope
- B. God's endurance comes in the harmony of the church, 5
 - 5. With one another, 5
 - 6. For the glory of God, 6
 - 7. Welcome one another, 7
- C. Christ Became a Servant
 - 8. To confirm the promises, 8 (note the Scripture references Paul uses)
 - 9. That the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy, 9
 - 10. Mercy: the most important of God's work fulfilled in Christ

Conclusions:

- The fulfillment of the Kingdom means encouragement, endurance, and hope for us.
- These things are God's work in you.
- God's promises are certified in Christ.
- By God, may we all be filled joy, peace, and hope by our faith, 13.
