Title: AGELESS PRINCIPLES

(Chatham, NJ; 10/11/15, AM) [Pc - Topical]

Theme: Seeking wisdom, doing good, and walking humbly are ageless principles that lead people in a life of godliness in any time.

Purpose: To encourage us to live by all of these things.

Introduction:

- 1. The Word of God is not only sharper than a two-edged sword, but it is also an ageless source of wisdom.
- 2. The spiritual nature of man has not changed since the beginning.
- 3. The words of scripture have addressed our most basic spiritual needs despite the age of these writings.
- 4. Today we consider three of the ageless principles revealed in the Bible, the Word of God.

I. The Song of Moses, Psalm 90

- A. Wisdom to number our days, 12
 - 1. Begins with the nature of God, 1-4
 - 2. God transcends time; he is ageless
 - 3. A long time to us is nothing to God, 4
 - 4. By contrast, our time is limited on this earth, 10
 - 5. Moses prayer asks for the wisdom to make use of the short time we have
 - 6. Furthermore, he asks for love (14), joy (15), revelation (16), also favor and meaningful labor (17).
 - 7. All of these come from recognizing our mortality.
- B. Yet the Gospel gives us a newer and better perspective
 - 1. The resurrection gives us a solid view of eternity
 - 2. We will not all sleep, but we'll be changed, 1 Corinthians 15:51
 - 3. The dead will be raised imperishable, 52
 - 4. Mortality will put on immortality, 53
 - 5. We won't need the wisdom to number our days since they will never end
 - 6. The perishable will put on the imperishable, 54
 - 7. Death will be swallowed up.
 - 8. Through Moses God offered wisdom; through Christ he offers eternity.

II. Seek the Lord, Seek Good, Amos 5:4-7

- A. Amos, the prophet who wasn't a prophet, Amos 7:14
 - 1. During the reign of Jeroboam II in Israel
 - 2. Like most of the northern kings, he did evil
 - 3. Amos confronted Israel with her sins
 - 4. Among other things they had perverted justice and rejected righteousness, 5:7
 - 5. They hated correction and abhorred anyone who dared speak the truth
 - 6. Several times he warns them to seek good and turn from evil. 4. 6. 14. 15
 - 7. Not doing these things doomed them to judgment and destruction

B. God sought us

- 1. The good shepherd has gone to the trouble of seeking us: he lays down his life for the sheep
- 2. We have an even greater opportunity to escape the judgment reserved for those who don't seek God and do good
- 3. Peter (Acts 2:40) exhorts his listeners: "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation."

- 4. The Gospel is the new plan for seeking him and seeking good.
- 5. Amos' exhortations to "seek good and not evil," and "hate evil, and love good," come in the words of the Gospel of salvation
- 6. His words carry even more weight today because God has provided the means and the power to do this
- 7. Through Christ we put off sin and put on righteousness

III. Humility Is Better than Pride

- A. The first shall be last and the last first, Mark 10:31
 - 1. In the Kingdom of God, the order of importance is reversed
 - 2. In this same chapter he rebukes the disciples for seeking prestige and power
 - 3. He told those who sought the best places at feasts to seek the lower places
 - 4. Romans 12:3 exhorted everyone "not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment."
 - 5. Naaman was insulted that that he only had to do something as humiliating as washing in the Jordan river, but eventually he humbled himself to the task
 - 6. Of the two son Jesus talked about one refused his father's order to work in the fields but eventually he submitted
- B. Kingdom living rewards the humble not the proud
 - 1. James 4:1 and 1 Peter 5:5 both remind their audiences that God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble
 - 2. 1 Corinthians 12 assures the Corinthians that no one can claim a greater sense of importance in the body of Christ
 - 3. The great news of the Gospel is that we have a savior who humbled himself to become a servant
 - 4. We are called to the same humility

Conclusion:

- 1. The wisdom to number our days and use what time we have wisely is still important.
- 2. Maybe more so now because we have eternity to think about
- 3. Seek good and hate evil will always be the mantra of a righteous person.
- 4. Do this and you will live.
- 5. Humble yourself under God's hand, and he will lift you up.
- 6. Follow Christ's example of service.
- 7. Obey the Gospel: these principles find their fulfillment in it.
